Reaching Out, Registering, & Reconnecting

We have had a very busy spring! Midterm elections are May 3, so our Vote411 committee has been working diligently to update the website for voters. They invited 95 Porter County candidates to answer questions about their platform, and there has been a great response. I attended the **Duneland Chamber** Candidate Forum on March 31 and was able to remind candidates about the deadline to have their responses included on Vote411.org. Take a look at the site to see if candidates in your area have responded. It was very encouraging to have a few candidates approach me with positive feedback about the site.

Earlier this year we decided to dedicate our resources to reactivating our **High School Voter Registration program** this spring. Barb Domer has taken up that challenge and through much hard work and tenacity, she has reconnected with many Porter County high

schools and registered many students. Barb updated LWV's high school power point presentation to include very timely, relevant information. Please see details on the project on page 2. A huge shout out to Barb for her efforts, as well as Lynda Krueger and all the volunteers who have helped make this a success!

I have been working with three **Valparaiso University** students over the last two months on a project to build awareness on campus about Vote411. I joined two of the students on April 11 in Harre Union to hand out flyers and Vote411 cards. We talked with over 45 students. Many were already registered to vote, so we made them aware of the

importance of checking their registration. Since the majority were from outside Porter County and many were from out of state, we could not actually register anyone, but they were very excited about being able to register online.

It was wonderful to see 12 members at our **in-person March meeting at Trinity Lutheran Church**. We had several members attend via Zoom. This hybrid mode worked well, so we will continue it for upcoming meetings. The space is perfect for our current size, and it has room to accommodate future growth! The kitchen will be great for hosting events. We are working on a plan for an open house to encourage new members—details to come. Hope to see more of you at future meetings.

Mark you calendar—**our annual meeting** will be on Monday, June 20. This is where we talk about our plans for the coming year. We will

also planning to have a mini-celebration.

Back to School

New Voter Registration Drive Kicked off March 14

One of the League's initiatives for 2022 is to visit local high schools, colleges, and universities to talk

about elections and help students register to vote. Our last new voter registration drive in the schools was in 2018, so it feels good to engage with students again! To date, we have visited five schools (Portage High School, Porter County Career & Technical Center, Ivy Tech Community College, Boone Grove High School, Union Township High School, and Valparaiso University). We've registered over 200 students!

Many students registered using electronic devices and commented how easy it was to register. According to US Census numbers, only 53.7 percent of US citizens between the ages of 18 and 24 in the Midwest reported that they voted in the 2020 general election—and only

61.4 percent of US citizens in that age group reported that they are registered to vote.

Part of our presentation includes an interactive activity that demonstrates the levels of young voter registration and participation. We are also sharing stories as a means of encouraging voter registration and participation. Five voter registration events remaining during the month of April (Kouts Middle-High School, Valparaiso High School, Hebron High School, Vale Academy) and the final registration tally will be shared in the next newsletter. Thank you to all who volunteered for this important initiative!

The Vote411 Committee contacted 95 local candidates with questions related to their platform and the office they are pursing in the May 3 primary election. Thirty candidates responded, and the committee published their information on vote411.org on April 8.
